

Record notes of the adjourned meeting of 18th February 2026 of the Apex Council of Tripura Cricket Association rescheduled and held on 13th March, 2026 (Friday) at 2.00 pm at the head office, TCA.

Shri Upananda Debbarma (acting President), Hon. Vice- President of Tripura Cricket Association presided over the meeting.

Shri Jayanta Dey Hon. Joint Secretary was informed about the meeting but remained absent without prior intimation.

In absence of the President, the Vice-President delivered as acting President and chaired the meeting.

The said meeting was called to order after ascertaining that the requisite quorum turned-up.

With the permission of all the members present, the notice convening the meeting having already circulated was taken on record.

The Chairman of the meeting congratulated all the members present and addressed the house.

Agenda – 1

Confirmation of the minutes of last Apex Council meeting held on 27/11/2025

The chairman placed the minutes of the last Apex Council meeting held on 27th November 2025 for confirmation.

The said minutes were confirmed unanimously by all the members present in the meeting.

Agenda – 2

Decision in respect of providing participation Money to the winning teams of Women's under 15 one day Trophy Plate Group of BCCI 2025-2026 and under 19 Women's one day Trophy Plate Group of BCCI 2025-2026.

As per BCCI Schedule under 15 Women's one day Trophy Plate Group of 2025-2026 took place in Guwahati and under 19 Women's one day Trophy Plate Group of 2025-2026 took place in Nagpur, where Tripura team has also participated. For the first time of the cricket history of TCA Tripura team has won both the tournaments and declared as champion of the respective tournaments.

Being a credible event, the Apex Council has decided to provide cash reward to both the teams to create a flow of encouragement for the sake of development of cricket in Tripura.

After detail discussion it has been **resolved that**, TCA will provide ₹10 lakh to each team (players and supporting staffs) as cash reward.



Agenda – 3

Proposal to provide participation money to the participating team in under 18 age group State Meet (three days) to be run by TCA.

In the Apex Council meeting held on 27th November 2025, it was resolved to organize the Under-18 age group State Meets during the cricket season 2025–2026, conducted by TCA in a two-day format. Another meeting was organized on 10th December 2025, in MBB Stadium in the presence of all clubs and subdivisions affiliated with TCA to discuss the format of the under 18 State Meet. In the meeting it was discussed that playing two innings by one team would not be feasible in a two-days format. A three-days format would be adequate. After detailed discussion it was proposed to place the said proposal by the secretary, TCA, before Apex Council for reviewing the earlier decision. Accordingly, the said matter has been taken up for today's meeting agenda.

The entire Apex Council has elaborately discussed and examined the proposal for review of the existing tournament format and unanimously decided to revise the format of the tournament.

RESOLVED THAT, the tournament shall henceforth be conducted in 3 days (Three) format with effect from the cricket season 2025-2026 and onwards.

Agenda – 4

Decision on investment of BCCI fund worth INR of 15 Cr in different banks on basis of better financial rate.

TCA has received Rs 15cr funding from BCCI on 18/02/2026, and this money needs to be invested to a bank depending on the interest rate. Since interest rates differ across banks, it is crucial to evaluate various options and select the most beneficial one with a higher interest rate.

RESOLVED THAT, any variation to this principal of investment, arising out of practical necessity, shall require prior approval of the Apex Council. The BCCI fund amounting to ₹15 Cr shall now be invested in banks offering the most favourable rate of interest, with preference given to nationalised banks.

Agenda – 5

Decision for disposal on Income Tax penalty amount for the FY 2018-2019.

1. Nature and Magnitude of the Matter

Sikdar & Associates was engaged on contract, success-based arrangement for vacating the Assessment Order for A.Y. 2018-19 and ensuring deletion of:

Tax Demand: ₹9,82,49,549

Proposed Penalty: ₹19,64,99,098

Interest: 12% p.a. for approximately 7 years (since A.Y. 2017-18)

The cumulative exposure, including tax, penalty and interest, exceeds **₹35 crores**.

Further, successful vacation of the confirmed order would result in:

Refund of tax already paid / TDS amounting to ₹1.65 crore.



Thus, the matter involves extremely high financial stakes and substantial litigation involvement.

2. Basis of professional fee.

Professional fee offered by the tax consultant is structured **purely on a success basis**, calculated at:

4.5% of the assessed tax liability, i.e.,

4.5% of ₹9,82,49,549 (earlier based on the weightage of case the percentage was decided (from 3%, 1.5% as professional fee was given))

This fee is:

Contingent upon successful relief.

Directly proportionate to the tax demand sought to be deleted.

Not calculated on penalty or interest components, despite the fact that our work would eliminate the entire exposure (tax + penalty + interest).

RESOLVED THAT, engagement of agency for Income Tax Matters- AY 2018-19

The matter regarding engagement of a professional agency to handle Income Tax issues of the Tripura Cricket Association (TCA) for the **Assessment year 2018-19** was discussed with various professional, including MR. Ratan Das & Co, Mr. Saikat Datta & Associates, and Mr. P. Sikdar & Associates.

After due deliberation and considering the expertise and confidence demonstrated, it was resolved to engage **Mr. Pranab Sikdar, Sikdar & Associates, Advocate & Consultant (Indirect Taxes), Shilong**, to handle all matters related to Income Tax notice and assessment orders for the said assessment year. The objective is to get the assessment orders vacated and to ensure that all related tax demands are set aside, relieving TCA of any tax liability for AY 2018-19

The professional fees, initially proposed at 4.5% of the assessed tax liability (₹9,82,49,549), were renegotiated and finalized as follows, based on discussion led by the Chief Advisor, Mr. T.K. Lodh:

- 1) **2.5% of the tax demand** in case the matter is successfully resolved at the ITAT level.
- 2) **Additional 1%** in case the matter proceeds to the High Court/ Supreme Court on substantial question of law arising from any adverse ITAT order. The fees shall be payable **only upon successful vacation of the tax demand for AY 2018-19**

The fees shall be payable **only upon successful vacation of the tax demand for AY 2018-19**.

Tax Liability Details:

- Total Tax Demand: ₹9,82,49,549
- Less: TDS Recovered: ₹1,65,40,456
- Net Demand: ₹8,17,09,093

Agenda – 6

Decision for arranging skill of “Tally” operation in an Accounts clerk of TCA.

For accounts management “Tally” software operation is necessary. Now it is temporarily supported one video analyst. But due to his little senses on so in accounts, it is not smooth going. Hence, it is required to get an Accounts Clerk having skill to operate “Tally” software.

RESOLVED THAT, one Accounts Clerk with knowledge of Tally shall be appointed on a contract basis to handle accounting and related work.

Agenda – 7

Decision on current roles and responsibility of Bimal Basfore as Coach.

It is observed that presently Mr. Bimal Basfore coach on role of TCA is physically weak to perform his duty due to ill health partial paralyse disability. His present posting at Bishalghar is causing the performance more infeasible.

RESOLVED THAT, considering his ill health, his services may be utilised with appropriate deployment.

Agenda – 8

Consideration on a suggestion to allow maximum 5 players for playing school cricket tournament for and on behalf of any school belong to Sadar sub-division.

It has been observed that several schools under the Sadar Sub-Division are not participating in the Sadar Inter-School Cricket Tournament (Boys & Girls). As a result, many talented boys and girls studying in those schools are missing the opportunity to participate in the tournament and showcase their cricketing skills.

In view of this, a proposal was placed that a maximum of five (5) players from any nearby non-participating school may be allowed to get included a participating school under Sadar Sub-Division in the Sadar Inter-School Cricket Tournament (Boys & Girls). This provision would ensure that deserving players are not deprived of the opportunity to compete. However, such players would be required to produce a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their respective schools to be eligible to participate in the tournament. It was discussed and felt that the principle as proposed may and managerially work.

RESOLVED THAT, no such policy decision would be taken presently. Specific identified cases would be dealt on merit.

Agenda – 9

To finalize the date, time and Venue for distribution of “108” numbers of Kit Bags.

The State Bank Of India Agartala branch has sponsored 100 numbers of kit bags from CSR fund to TCA and on basis of the total requirement TCA has procured additional 8 numbers of Kit Bags. It is proposed to organise a befitting program for distribution of those Kit Bags for which date need to be finalised.

RESOLVED THAT, the date, time, and venue for the distribution of kit bags shall be finalized by the three signatory office bearers after locating availability of special guest.



Agenda – 10

Decision to extend the period of functioning of the adhoc committees of Kanchanpur Cricket Association and Sonamura Cricket Association.

Pursuant to the resolution of the Apex Council meeting held on 27th November'25, one month extension was allowed by TCA to adhoc committee of Kanchanpur Cricket Association and Sonamura Cricket Association respectively for functioning of the appointed cricket activities of their concern subdivision.

RESOLVED THAT, the Kanchanpur committee will ensure to submit a report to accomplish the constitution of new committee of Kanchanpur Cricket Association without taking further time.

2. The Ad hoc committee for Sonamura Cricket Association has already submitted its report on 10/3/2026. The report has been placed before the Apex Council for appraisal and decision towards accepting the new executive committee formed by Sonamura Cricket Association after taking recourse to constitutional provision and reported to be in order by Adhoch committee.

The Apex Council therefore, resolved to accept the report and recommendation of the Ad hoc committee headed by Sri Upananda Debbarma, Vice President and allow to recognise the Executive committee is comprised of the following members/ office bearers.

Decision on execution of remaining work on priority in connection with construction of International Stadium at TIT.

It was discussed in the meeting that the agency for this construction is working very slow and spoiling time. Proper action need be taken by the Engineering in charge.

RESOLVED THAT, the work should be finalised with the agency in terms of the settlement agreement done under the court order. Remaining work may be done separately.

Decision for recruit Junior Pitch Curator on contract basis.

RESOLVED THAT, Deferred to the next meeting.

Agenda – 13

Decision for recruit Junior Engineer- Electrical on contract basis.

RESOLVED THAT, Deferred to the next meeting.



Agenda – 14

Review of progress on formation of advisory committee for operation of domestic Cricket.

Pursuant to the resolution of the last Annual General Meeting held on 10th Octobe'25, the finalization of the list of the members of advisory committees would be done by the Office Bearers of TCA accordingly a meeting was conducted. The proposed list for the same was prepared and placed before the council as Annexure II.

RESOLVED THAT, The Apex Council accepted and approved the list of members for the new Advisory Committee. The committee shall function to provide guidance and advice on behalf of the members, to the professional through the Secretary, TCA and shall remain accountable to the Apex Council or the General Body. The said committees will function in accordance with power delegated to it and operational procedure as given by specific administrative order of TCA .

Agenda – 15

Administrative approval and Expenditure sanction to the works of the Engineering section of TCA.

- I. Construction of practice shed for net practice at Dharmanagar Cricket Ground, Dharmanagar, North Tripura during the year 2025-26/Sh-concreting, fencing, brick flooring etc. (Estimate No. 21/EC/EST/25-26) Rs. 19,09,860.00
- II. Construction of practice shed for net practice at Amarpur School Cricket Ground, Gomati, South Tripura during the year 2025-26/Sh-concreting, fencing, brick flooring etc. (Estimate No. 26/EC/EST/25-26) Rs. 19,09,860.00
- III. Construction of Pump room in Kamalpur Cricket Ground during the year 2025-26(Estimate No. 24/EC/EST/25-26) Rs1,25,288.00

RESOLVED THAT, the Apex Council apprised of the estimates prepared by the executive Engineer and has accorded administrative approval and expenditure sanction for the aforesaid works of the Engineering Section. Estimate-wise approval will be communicated formally by the Secretary after due processing for records.

- IV. Dismantling of existing gallery in front of the Gym (North-East portion) at MBB Stadium during the year 2025-2026 (Estimate No. 22/EC/EST/25-26) Rs. 6,50,480.00
- V. Construction of 3 to 5 no's practice pitch for net practice at MBB stadium in front of Gym during the year 2025-26 (Estimate No. 22/EC/EST/25-26) Rs 3,10,650.00
- VI. Construction of diversion road at MBB Stadium from gate-1 to ground and construction of indoor practice pitch (3N0's) at lake view side in MBB Stadium the year 2025-26.

RESOLVED THAT, Decision on these works has been felt to be kept waited for further examination by the Engineering section.

- VII. **Purchase of 8 no's camera for video recording of various Domestic and National Tournaments matches during the year 2025-26.**

At present in TCA 10 no's camera are functioning as reported by Video analyst team of TCA. It is necessary to use 6 no's cameras in each ground for fair decision by the umpires as per BCCI guide line. During National Tournaments match this year we have hired 3 no's



cameras from local market to run the matches smoothly. To organize domestic tournaments in 3 no's ground total 18 no's camera required. So, it is proposed to purchase another 8 no's cameras for TCA. Estimated cost is Rs. 16,84,000.00 for 8 no's cameras as could be know from market survey by the Engineering Section.

RESOLVED THAT, at present 4 no's of new cameras may be purchased. A few out of order may be tried for repaired.

VIII. **Engagement of ground staff in Dharmanagar, Kamalpur and TIT ground.**

At Present there are no ground staffs in Dharmanagar, Kailashahar and Kamalpur cricket Ground, at TIT ground staffs from MBB, PTA and Taltala has been engaged to do the maintenance work. For routine maintenance work of these grounds to keep the ground in playing condition, it is proposed to engage 4 no's workers in each ground on daily basis.

RESOLVED THAT, three (3) local workers maybe engaged on daily basis for routine maintenance of work. Further, additional labour, if required, may also be engaged in addition to the said three (3) workers on need basis as per actual requirement and exigency for short period of time.

Agenda-16

Framing policy on apprentice scheme for new candidate who passed in cricket concerned course.

To develop the potentiality of cricket players in general and effective performance of participating state teams in National Tournaments for better performance. Tripura Cricket Association has not yet provided any regular employment in some category of essential performance.

There is no general round the year professional support system for teams. The service is seasonal only. Skilled performances are also not generally available among Tripura residents.

RESOLVED, under the circumstances, to launch apprenticeship scheme under Tripura Cricket Association fresh degree holders for candidates with cricket development course with a consolidated monthly stipend worth INR 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) per month only for 01 (One) year to create a pool of local skilled, proper educated state resident persons for hiring for the specific requirement.

In this context, it appears to be rational to adopt a general policy of apprenticeship for such fresh degree holders for such valuable service within TCA by providing this present engagement as apprentice, we may understand the effectiveness of such action.

Agenda - 17

Interim Budget during the financial year 2026-2027 (April'26 to September'26).

During the Apex Council meeting held on 13-3-2026, the Interim Budget was proposed by the incumbent Treasurer Shri Basudeb Chakraborty.

RESOLVED THAT, the Interim Budget during the financial year 2026-2027 (April'26 to September'26) as detailed in Annexure III with total amount of 64,78,60,000 (Sixty Four Crore



Seventy Eight Lakh Sixty Thousand Rupees Only) was unanimously passed by the house and proposed to place the same before the Special General Meeting for approval. The proposal will be placed before the Special General Meeting for approval.

Whereas, a significant variation is proposed compared to the previous year, a suitable footnote should be provided explaining the reason for the increase. This will ensure clarity, transparency and better understanding of the budget estimation.

Agenda – 18

Any other matter with the permission of chair.

1. Professional fees for EPF agency to increase from 500 Rs to 750 Rs.

One consultancy firm named Corporate Care Solutions owned by Mr. Partha Chakraborty at Gurkhabasti was engaged by TCA during the year 2012 on payment of Rs 500 as monthly professional fee for uploading and preparing challan at EPF portal. Presently they have made a request to enhance their monthly remuneration fee to 750 Rs.

RESOLVED THAT, the enhanced amount worth Rs 750/- (Rupees Seven Hundred Fifty only) is accorded approval for a period of six month with effect from March, 2026.

2. During the Cricket season 2025-2026 Tripura Cricket Association has conducted under-18 State Meet. The declaration of the prize money for champion and runners' team is still pending.

It was placed that during the 2024-2025 season, the Under-18 age level tournament was conducted with the participation limited to affiliated clubs only where the number of teams were 14.

However, in the season 2025-26 the structure of the Under-18 tournament was revised and converted into a State Meet Tournament, thereby allowing participation from both affiliated clubs as well subdivisional team thereby the number of teams participated to 32. This change was implemented with the objective of expanding participation and providing a wide competitive platform for young cricketers across the state with equal opportunity to all over the state.

During the discussion, it was noted that the prize money for both the Champion and Runners-up of the Under-18 tournament for the above-mentioned seasons had remained pending. The members have deliberated on the matter and have unanimously resolved that the prize money should be formally approved as:

For the season 2024-25 (Under-18 Age Level Tournament- Affiliated Clubs only):

- The Champion Team will be awarded a prize money of Rs 30,000.
- The Runner-up Team will be awarded a prize money of Rs 20,000.

For the season 2025-26 (Under-18 State Meet Tournament- Affiliated Clubs & Sub-Divisions):

- The Champion Team will be awarded a prize money of Rs 50,000.
- The Runner-up Team will be awarded a prize money of Rs 30,000.



3. Renewal of contract of Physiotherapist of TCA.

The contract period of Shri Suhag Chandra Saha, Shri Rajesh Kumar Modak, Smt. Misti Deb and Smt. Papiya Debnath, **Physiotherapist** of TCA has been end on

RESOLVED THAT, the contract of Shri Suhag Chandra Saha, Shri Rajesh Kumar Modak, Smt. Misti Deb and Smt. Papiya Debnath as Physiotherapist is renewed for a further period of next one year, effective from 15th March 2026 to 14th March 2027, with a 10% enhancement in salary then last agreement amount.

4. Renewal of contract of Office Cum Accounts Manager at Jirania Cricket Association.

The one-year contract period of Shri Tapan Debnath, Office Cum Account Manager of TCA will end on 30/3/2026.

RESOLVED THAT, to extend the contract period of Shri Tapan Debnath Office Cum Account Manager of TCA for one year for remuneration of 8000 Rs per month.

5. Request from Club to use 2 nos Match balls per innings in a match of Senior Club Tournament's.

The affiliated clubs requested the introduction of two new match balls per innings, to be used from two different ends, in the 50-over Senior Club League tournaments. The clubs stated that the quality of a single match ball deteriorates after being used for several overs, which affects the standard of play.

It was also mentioned that the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has already implemented this playing condition in its domestic tournaments for the past few seasons in order to maintain the quality of the ball throughout the innings. The clubs further expressed that introducing two match balls would help players gain better exposure to national-level playing conditions and contribute to improving their overall performance standards.

After detailed discussion, the members **resolved that**, at this point of time there is no need to implement the use of two new match balls from two different ends in the Senior Club League tournaments. The Committee observed that the present system does not have any significant impact on players' performance or on the overall results of the tournament. Additionally, implementing this system would increase the financial expenditure of the Association.

Therefore, the proposal was not approved at this stage, and the existing practice of using a single match ball per innings will continue until further review.



6. Request from club to provide match balls by TCA in Senior Club Tournaments.

It was discussed that till the last season, the affiliated Clubs used to collect the match balls from the Tripura Cricket Association (TCA), for which the cost price of the balls was deducted from their respective match money. Alternatively, Clubs were also allowed to purchase match balls individually from different sports shops or vendors.

In a meeting with clubs, several Clubs raised concerns that when match balls were purchased individually from different vendors or sports shops instead of through TCA, the quality often varied. In many cases, such balls became soft or lost their shape after being used for a few overs, which adversely affected the quality of cricket and the overall standard of the matches. The Clubs expressed satisfaction with the quality of balls supplied by TCA.

In view of the above, the affiliated Clubs requested the Tripura Cricket Association (TCA) to provide match balls for all Senior Club Tournaments. They further requested that the cost of such balls should not be deducted from their match money from the 2025–26 season onwards. The Clubs expressed that centralized supply of match balls by TCA would help maintain uniformity and ensure better playing conditions. Apart from this, the Clubs also requested that an adequate stock of used balls be kept ready so that a replacement can be provided in case a ball gets damaged, lost, or changes shape during the course of a match.

After detail discussion, it was **resolved that**, the proposal was accepted, and henceforth the Tripura Cricket Association (TCA) will provide match balls for all Senior Club Cricket Tournaments in which affiliated Clubs participate. This arrangement will be similar to the existing system where TCA provides match balls in State Meet tournaments participated in by the affiliated Sub-Divisions.

7. Request from Clubs 3 Venues to be used for both Bipul Majumder Memorial Super Division and Santosh Memorial A Division tournament.

It was informed that several affiliated clubs have requested that no matches of the Bipul Majumder Memorial Super Division & Santosh Memorial A Division 2025–26 be scheduled at Shahid Kaja Smriti Cricket Ground, Melaghar. The clubs expressed concerns regarding the ground condition and pitch quality in comparison with other venues, as well as the frequent loss of balls during matches. Additionally, it was noted that the said ground is located at a considerable distance from Agartala, which would create logistical difficulties and increase transportation costs for the participating teams.

In view of the above concerns, the affiliated clubs requested that the matches of both tournaments be conducted only at MBB Stadium, PTA Ground, and TIT Ground.

After detailed discussion, the members observed that the concerns raised by the affiliated clubs were reasonable and justified. Accordingly, it was **resolved that**, no matches of the Bipul Majumder Memorial Super Division & Santosh Memorial A Division 2025–26 will be scheduled at Shahid Kaja Smriti Cricket Ground, Melaghar, and the matches will be conducted at MBB Stadium, PTA Ground, and TIT Ground only.



8. Proposal for using 6 cameras instead of 4 for both Bipul Majumder Memorial Super Division and Santosh Memorial A Division tournament.

It was observed that over the past few seasons, a total of four (4) cameras has been deployed per match. Out of these, two (2) cameras are positioned at the two ends of the ground, while the remaining two (2) are placed to capture side views of the popping creases.

Despite this arrangement, certain angles of the popping creases remain unrecorded at times. This limitation results in partial blind spots, which may hinder the Match Referees while reviewing decisions, referred by the on-field umpires.

Now, it is deliberated on the need for enhanced visual coverage to ensure greater accuracy, fairness, and transparency in decision-making. It was proposed that two (2) additional cameras be installed, positioned on the opposite sides of the popping creases that are currently not covered. This would eliminate blind spots and provide comprehensive visual support during referrals.

It is hereby **resolved that**, in order to ensure fair and accurate decision-making and to provide adequate assistance to the Match Referees, the number of cameras to be deployed per match (at each ground) shall be increased from four (4) to six (6). The additional two (2) cameras shall be installed to cover the other sides of the popping creases.

9. Request from clubs to start Under-13 and Under-15 tournaments at the club level.

One of the affiliated clubs proposed that Under-13 and Under-15 tournaments be introduced by adding affiliated clubs. The club stated that, at present, the Sadar Under-13 and Under-15 tournaments are conducted with participation from Coaching Centres. From the 2024-25 season, clubs have also started participating in the Under-18 tournament in addition to the Senior Club Cricket Tournaments.

However, many clubs do not have their own junior teams. As a result, they often face difficulty in forming Under-18 teams and have to search for players at short notice. The club suggested that if Under-13 and Under-15 tournaments are conducted with affiliated clubs, it would help create a pool of players from the grassroots level, making it easier for clubs to build their Under-18 teams in the future.

It was also pointed out that many clubs currently depend on TCA-registered Coaching Centres to source players and, in several cases, they have to pay a considerable amount to these Coaching Centres. This creates additional financial pressure on the affiliated clubs.

After detailed discussion, it was **resolved that** no such initiative is required at the moment. The members noted that Coaching Centres are already participating in the Sadar Under-13 and Under-15 tournaments, and a separate State Meet is being conducted with participation from affiliated Sub-Divisions. Therefore, the existing system will continue for the time being.



10. Approval and acceptance of outdoor stadium chair tender.

After completing the market assessment by inviting open response/quotation expressing interest for supplying and installation of outdoor stadium chair from the intending eligible manufacturer/ authorized distributors/ authorized agents vide NIQ No - 04/TCA/AGT/2024-25 dated 18.06.2025 and out of total 7 no's response as per terms and conditions of the notice 3 no's intended qualified supplier/ manufacturer/ authorized agent were selected namely Uma Plastics Limited, Kolkata, B.S.
